Thank you for your interest in the post of **Inclusion Teaching Assistant and Midday Meal Supervisor** at Rumboldswyke Church of England Primary School.

This post is available from September 2026. We are seeking a motivated, organised and compassionate individual who is committed to supporting children with a wide range of additional needs. This includes pupils with barriers to learning such as speech and language difficulties, social communication needs, emotional wellbeing challenges, and those requiring support with personal care and independence. The successful candidate will share our vision of providing a nurturing, inclusive and creative Christian community where every child is supported to flourish. We believe that all members of our school community should have the opportunity to *“embrace life in all its fullness”* (John 10:10).

The role involves working closely with class teachers and the SENCo to support pupils’ learning, development and wellbeing both in the classroom and through targeted interventions. You will play a key role in promoting inclusion, enabling pupils to access learning, develop independence, and build positive relationships. This may include supporting communication approaches such as PECS or Makaton (training can be provided), delivering structured interventions, and responding to individual needs with care and consistency.

In addition, you will support pupils during breaktimes and lunchtimes, actively promoting positive play, social interaction and wellbeing, while ensuring the safety and supervision of all children.

Staff at Rumboldswyke School are part of the wider Bishop Luffa Learning Partnership, working collaboratively to continually improve outcomes for all pupils. We are proud of our inclusive ethos and our commitment to meeting the needs of every child.

We are looking for someone who is warm, patient and resilient, with a genuine passion for working with children, particularly those with additional needs. You should be able to work effectively as part of a team, show initiative, and demonstrate a strong commitment to safeguarding and inclusion. Previous experience in a school or similar setting is desirable.

About Us

Rumboldswyke Church of England Primary School is a small, inclusive primary school located at the heart of Chichester. In October 2020, the school became part of the Bishop Luffa Learning Partnership, working collaboratively with other schools to further strengthen provision and outcomes for all pupils.

The school currently has approximately 127 pupils on roll, spanning Early Years Foundation Stage through to Year 6. We are proud of our nurturing ethos and our commitment to meeting the needs of every child, including those with additional needs and barriers to learning.

At Rumboldswyke, we believe that children learn best when their learning is meaningful and purposeful. Our curriculum is delivered through carefully planned "learning experiences," each centred around a key question and underpinned by three or four Christian values. These values are closely linked to our collective worship programme, enabling pupils to explore and reflect on their meaning across different contexts, both past and present, and consider their relevance in today's world.
